March 2015

March 2, 9, 16, and 30: Warning Coordination Meteorologist *Barry Goldsmith* and Meteorologist *Erin Billings* participated by e-mail, phone, or both, in the **Weekly Texas Drought Monitor Teleconference**.

March 3: *Barry Goldsmith* gave a live **interview** about Severe Weather Awareness Week on **Fox 2 Good Day Valley**, and a taped **interview** highlighting severe, hazardous and spring preparedness season with Annalise Ortiz at **Valley Central KGBT Channel 4**.

March 4: *Erin Billings* provided an **interview** to **Telemundo** regarding possible freezing drizzle, and a second longer feature **interview** to the **Valley Morning Star** regarding rainfall from October 2014 through March 4, 2015.

Blair Scholl taught **two Skywarn classes** in **Brownsville** at the Brownsville Central Public Library to 31 students, and *Barry Goldsmith* taught a **Skywarn class** in Brownsville at the Brownsville Central Public Library that evening to about a dozen students.

Senior Forecaster *Mike Castillo* gave a **presentation** and an **office tour** to a group of 7 students from **Kaplan College**.

March 5: *Barry Goldsmith* recorded **video and sound bites** for Severe Weather Awareness Week and hurricane preparedness with Rick Lara of **PharrNow**. *Barry* also attended the **Lower Rio Grande Valley Development Council (LRGVC) Homeland Security Advisory Committee (HSAC) Monthly Meeting** in Weslaco.

Forecaster *Maria Torres* provided a **Spanish interview** on Severe Weather Awareness Week with **Radio Esperanza** in Edinburg and invited their listeners to attend the weather festival. *Maria* also taped **two interviews** on Severe Weather Awareness Week with the **City of Edinburg** and invited the community to attend the weather festival.

April 2015

April 1: Forecaster *Justin Gibbs* attended the **Rio Grande Valley Hurricane Evacuation Study Status Update meeting** at the Brownsville Central Public Library.

April 2-3: *Barry Goldsmith* attended the **2015 National Hurricane Conference** in Austin. On April 2, Barry participated in a session entitled “Private Industry – The Changing Face of Hurricane Meteorology and What It Means to Business.” Barry’s **presentation** was titled “Hurricane Information for Business Protection: Forecasts You Can Use to Make Smart Decisions.”, and was attended by a dozen conference-goers.

April 8 – 11: *Barry Goldsmith* attended the **2015 Tropical Weather Conference** on South Padre Island. Barry joined WCMs John Metz (WFO CRP) and Dan Reilly (WFO HGX) for the **opening presentation**. Barry’s talk, titled “Seamless Impact-Based Decision Support in Hurricanes,” described opening alternate operating locations for WFO Brownsville Decision Support in Weslaco should the office location in Brownsville be compromised by a natural or manmade catastrophe.

April 10-11: *Erin Billings* and *Chris Birchfield* provided **onsite weather support** for the **2015 Pharr Hub Phestival**. Heavy rainfall and frequent lightning on April 10th required *Erin* to provide additional support for hazardous weather to help ensure the safety of thousands of fair-goers.

April 14 – 15: Information Technology Officer *Pablo Gonzalez* and *Barry Goldsmith* staffed a booth at the **2015 South Texas Hurricane Conference** in McAllen. More than 1100 persons attended the conference, and several hundred stopped by the booth to pick up information and discuss weather and hurricanes. On April 15, *Barry* presented to a full room of over 100 persons “Building a Weather Ready Rio Grande Valley: One Person, One Family, One Neighborhood at a Time.

April 22 – *Maria Torres* gave a hurricane preparedness **presentation** in **Spanish** as part of the **Good Neighbor Program** to 10 residents in the Rockwell Manor Apartments in Brownsville.
