...MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER 2009...

I. TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW

A PROGRESSIVE TROUGH AND RIDGE PATTERN BROUGHT SEVERAL PERIODS OF SNOW FOLLOWED BY OUTBREAKS OF BELOW NORMAL TEMPERATURES ACROSS NORTHERN ARIZONA IN DECEMBER. A COUPLE OF THE LOW PRESSURE SYSTEMS...NOTABLY DECEMBER 6TH THROUGH 8TH...AND THEN ON DECEMBER 12TH AND 13TH...PRODUCED LARGE AMOUNTS PRECIPITATION FOR MANY LOCATIONS ACROSS NORTHERN ARIZONA. NORTHERLY FLOW BEHIND THESE SYSTEMS USHERED IN COLD AND DRY AIR MASSES THAT REMAINED IN PLACE FOR SEVERAL DAYS.

II. SELECTED RECORDS

A SERIES OF COLD AIR MASSES SETTLED ACROSS NORTHERN ARIZONA DURING THE FIRST HALF OF DECEMBER. CLEAR NIGHTS UNDER STRONG HIGH PRESSURE RESULTED IN RECORD LOW TEMPERATURES FOR SEVERAL LOCATIONS ON DECEMBER 5TH AND THEN ON DECEMBER 10TH AND 11TH.

III. SIGNIFICANT WEATHER

MUCH NEEDED DROUGHT RELIEF ARRIVED DECEMBER 6TH THROUGH 8TH AS A VERY STRONG LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM MOVED ACROSS NORTHERN ARIZONA. MANY LOCATIONS IN THE HIGHER TERRAIN SAW BLIZZARD CONDITIONS AND HEAVY SNOWFALL TOTALS. LOW ELEVATIONS RECEIVED STEADY RAINFALL FOR SEVERAL HOURS DURING THE STORM.

WITH THE END OF THE YEAR PASSING SEVERAL LOCATIONS IN NORTHERN ARIZONA IN 2009 EXPERIENCED THEIR TOP TEN DRIEST YEAR ALL TIME.
