...MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR FEBRUARY 2010...

... TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

TEMPERATURES...ESPECIALLY MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES...WERE BELOW NORMAL ACROSS NORTHERN ARIZONA IN FEBRUARY. THIS DEPARTURE FROM NORMAL MAY HAVE BEEN ATTRIBUTED IN PART BY A SOUTHWARD DISPLACED SUBTROPICAL JET STREAM DURING MOST OF THE MONTH. SNOWFALL WAS ABOVE NORMAL FOR FEBRUARY ALTHOUGH PRECIPITATION WAS ABOUT NORMAL FOR THE MONTH. THE HIGHER SNOWFALL TOTALS WERE DUE TO A HIGHER THAN NORMAL AMOUNT OF PRECIPITATION FALLING IN THE FORM OF SNOW ...RATHER THAN RAIN.

...SIGNIFICANT WEATHER...

A PACIFIC STORM BROUGHT WIDESPREAD MOUNTAIN SNOW TO NORTHERN ARIZONA ON SATURDAY NIGHT (FEB 6TH) AND SUNDAY (FEB 7TH). THE HEAVIEST SNOW AND LARGEST SNOW ACCUMULATIONS WERE OBSERVED ACROSS THE WESTERN

MOGOLLON RIM ON SATURDAY NIGHT. OTHER MOUNTAIN LOCATIONS RECEIVED LIGHTER SNOW AMOUNTS. SCATTERED SHOWERS CONTINUED ON SUNDAY BUT LITTLE ACCUMULATION WAS OBSERVED.
