#### MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR MARCH 2013


#### ...TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

MARCH 2013 WAS DOMINATED BY WARM AND DRY WEATHER ACROSS ARIZONA. BOTH HIGH AND LOW TEMPERATURES WERE ABOVE NORMAL, WITH HIGH TEMPERATURES RUNNING SIGNIFICANTLY WARMER THAN NORMAL. ONE PACIFIC STORM SYSTEM IMPACTED THE STATE MARCH  $8-9^{\mathrm{TH}}$  BRINGING WELCOME LOW ELEVATION RAIN AND HIGH ELEVATION SNOWFALL, BUT WITH THE REMAINDER OF THE MONTH BEING DRY MOST AREAS ENDED UP WITH MUCH LESS PRECIPITATION THAN NORMAL.

A STRONG PACIFIC STORM SYSTEM BROUGHT ACCUMULATING SNOW TO MUCH OF NORTHERN ARIZONA FROM FRIDAY, MARCH 8<sup>TH</sup> THROUGH SATURDAY, MARCH 9TH. THE HEAVIEST TOTALS WERE FOUND ABOVE 6000 FEET WHERE PREDOMINANTLY SNOW FELL. IN THE ELEVATION RANGE BETWEEN FOUR AND SIX THOUSAND FEET...PRECIPITATION STARTED AS RAIN AND CHANGED TO SNOW WITH LIGHT ACCUMULATIONS OF SNOW REPORTED AS LOW AS 3800 FEET.
