MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR OCTOBER 2012


...TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

High pressure prevailed across northern Arizona during most of October. This resulted in significantly warmer than normal daytime temperatures, with near or slightly below normal overnight lows due to the dry air mass. The only precipitation for the entire month came on the $11^{\rm th}$ and $12^{\rm th}$ as a closed low pressure system moved across the state. Monthly precipitation across all of northern Arizona was well below normal.

... SIGNIFICANT WEATHER...

October 11th-12th: A low pressure system moved across the state, bringing widespread rain showers and a few thunderstorms. The heaviest rain was reported in the Flagstaff area where around an inch was recorded. A few strong thunderstorms developed during the early morning hours of October 12th. Radar indicated a possible tornado near Aripine at 208 AM, and a Tornado Warning was issued, though no reports of a tornado were received. Much colder air moved in on the morning of the 12th, with light snow reported near Flagstaff. On the north rim of the Grand Canyon, 1.5 inches of snow was measured.
