Flood Event of 7/14/1996-7/16/1996

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## Weather Summary

Hurricane Bertha made landfall near Wilmington, NC on the 12th of July. Bertha weakened to a tropical storm shortly thereafter and continued moving up the MidAtlantic Coast. Tropical Storm Warnings were issued for much of the region including for the Jersey Shore. Bertha dumped very heavy rain across much New Jersey as it began to convert to an extratropical storm on the 13th and 14th. Bertha officially became an extratropical storm on the 14th near the Maine coastline as it a frontal system pushed in behind it on the 15th and 16th. Much of New Jersey had over 2 inches of rain. Some locations in Northern New Jersey such as West Milford received 4.85 inches from Bertha alone which led to minor flooding across the Passaic Basin on the 14th. The passage of the front brought additional rain afterwards which caused Rancocas Creek to crest on the 16th of the month.
