Mesoscale Precipitation Discussion (FFGMPD): Effective on or  
about May 19, 2025

This service change affects the WPC MetWatch Mesoscale  
Precipitation Discussion (FFGMPD) product. Effective on or about  
Monday, May 19, 2025, the National Weather Service (NWS) will  
replace the River Forecast Center (RFC) 5-letter identifier  
codes with 3-letter identifier codes. RFC codes are provided in  
the "ATTN..." section of the product to highlight awareness of  
excessive precipitation within the boundaries of the RFC area.
